

What Do Writers and Authors Do?

I need an article of five thousand words on the migration habits of snail darters. I need a four-thousand-word article on prison inmate recidivism for the five western states.

If you decide to work as a paid writer (freelancer), make sure you have the right tools to do the job. You will get inquiries about writing content for common media types. You might tackle a job such as fiction novels, scripts, poetry, technical manuals, and want ads.

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You must know how to conduct verifiable research online. A tablet, PC or laptop computer are a must. This means citing references and resources. It would be a good thing to have your own professionally created website with examples of your work. You are proficient in more than one word processing computer applications.

You will want to have a good answer when a prospective client how you manage your customer service and gigs. Show them how you are a problem solver and understand deadlines.

VBlog book tours, interview other authors

The main character in a fiction novel can face up against multiple obstacles. He can also huddle down in a cold corner while nature throws, rain and snow at him. Of course there can be another person sniffing out his trail. Show how the character is in pain from a storm, nursing a head wound from an accident, or a non-fatal bullet wound. Curious fans want to know these things so don't go unprepared.

The Ghostwriter Gig:

From time to time, writers are contacted by other authors to get sections of a book written. That means 5,000 to 50,000 words with a deadline. Nobody will ever know it was you that wrote that section and you will not get credit, unless the client chooses to reference you.

Enhancing The Character:

Tell your audience one tidbit about the character that will not come out in the story you write. Let the audience wonder if it is a misleading morsel or something the story will hinge on later. Your bad guy must face near-death just like your good guy. Show them falling off that dusty cliff, tied to the railroad tracks with the train coming, or the parachute that just won't open.


